Chair Means called the meeting to order at 8:07 a.m. The Audit Committee will be noted as a Special Board meeting since more than four Commissioners were present. All of the above Commissioners were present at the start of the meeting.

1. <u>AUDIT COMMITTEE SELECTION AND RECOMMENDATION OF A CONSULTANT FOR ASSISTANCE IN ESTABLISHING AN INTERNAL AUDIT FUNCTION</u>

Chair Means stated the Committee will hear presentations from the three respondents to the Request For Proposals for assistance in establishing an internal audit function. The Committee will select a firm to recommend to the full Board. Ms. Caroline Dinu, Senior Management Analyst II, announced the three firms to be interviewed today and the order in which they will be heard.

DISCUSSION/SELECTION:

The Committee reviewed the presentations by the three firms to determine which firm would best fulfill the position to assistance LAFPP in establishing the internal audit function.

MOTION

Commissioner Diannitto moved that the Audit Committee recommend to the full Board that it hire Accretive Solutions as the consultant to assist in establishing an internal audit function, pending negotiations regarding their fee structure, which was seconded by Commissioner Aliano and approved by the following vote: ayes, Commissioners Aliano (abstained), Diannitto, Broidy, Chair Means – 4; nays, none.

2. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mr. Benjamin Pezzillo, Business Agent and bona fide union representative of Local 8000, AFL-CIO, Engineers and Architects Association (EAA), gave a public comment regarding the department's accountants, auditors and management analysts, with respect to contracting out for the internal audit function. Mr. Pezzillo stated he previously communicated with LAFPP regarding contracting out for services that can be provided by City employees and further discussed the Meet and Confer issue that the union believes has been violated by the LAFPP. Mr. Alan Manning, Assistant City Attorney stated that the matter has been addressed by the City Attorney's Office and the EAA's request is not

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consistent with the City Charter. Therefore, this information has been communicated to EAA via letters and City Attorney Manning stated he would provide said letters to Board Members at their request.
